A timeless classic, now accessible to the intermediate orchestra! Ludwig van Beethoven premiered his *First Symphony* at the Royal Imperial Theater in Vienna on April 2, 1800. The second movement is reminiscent of Mozart's *G minor Symphony*, but to use the term "Mozartian" is to judge this work superficially. As it progresses, this movement begins to stir restlessly, and is one of Beethoven's most memorable and lyrical pieces.
