## PROGRAM NOTES

Hampshire March is based on the original opening of the first movement of "Second Suite in F for Military Band." Holst replaced this section with the now-familiar Morris Dance tune, "Glory Shears," as the work was developing. The 38-measure passage (crossed out in the autograph score) draws upon the English folk song, "Young Reilly," and presents an alluring work in itself for younger players.

## **NOTES TO THE CONDUCTOR**

Holst's initial concept corresponds to measures 4 through 41 in this arrangement. An introduction and closing material (in the composer's style) have been added, as has a repeat to lengthen the work. Also, the key has been raised a major second to keep within the range and instrumentation parameters of this series. The original percussion scoring calls for only snare drum and bass drum. Additional parts for bells, timpani, triangle, and crash cymbals have been included.
