## PROGRAM NOTE

Combining David Shaffer's masterful scoring and humorist Ralph Venezia's creative storytelling skills, *Fantoms By Firelight*'s clever narration paints a vivid musical portrait of the Fantoms that, if you look around, you will know it's true! They might be sitting right next to you.

## NOTES TO CONDUCTOR

The emphasis of this composition is musical entertainment and performance fun. Written for narrator and band, the most important elements of this composition are the narration and clever musical sound effects that accompany the narration. Selecting a dynamic narrator is imperative to the piece's success. That person should be allowed as much creative liberty as possible to create a mystic and mysterious setting throughout the piece's performance. Tempos should be observed as closely as possible to maximize the musical sound effects throughout the piece. The narrations have also been timed to fill each narrated phrase accurately.

- The introduction culminates with the emphasized sforzando on beat 4 of measure 8. Allow a dynamic pause before beginning the narration over the fermata in measure 9.
- Musical sound effects, such as in measures 18 and 19, should be emphasized.
- Measure 36, and its repeat in measure 64, should be played with force, mimicking the intensity of the narration.
- Take liberty with the length of the pause (or holds) of all measures with fermatas to maximize the dramatic effect of the storyline, such as in measure 54.
- The ritard in measures 70, 71 and 72 should be broad and dramatic, with beat 1 of measure 73 being the loudest point in the piece, followed by a raucous and extended scream from all band members on beat 3.
- Allow the ending to fade away with the chime note in measure 77, holding for several seconds.

## ABOUT THE COMPOSER



**David Shaffer** was born in Columbus, Ohio and attended Grove City High School, Grove City, Ohio. He holds a Bachelor Degree from the Ohio State University and a Master of Music Degree from Miami University (Ohio). Mr. Shaffer has taught in the Hamilton, Ohio; Northridge, Ohio; and Wyoming, Ohio schools. From 1978 to 2011 Mr. Shaffer served on the faculty of Miami University teaching courses in music composition, music theory and music education. Additionally, Mr. Shaffer directed the Miami University Marching Band from 1998 to 2011. Under his direction, the Miami Band performed for several regional Bands of America Contests and in 2003 the Miami Band was selected as the "Santa Band" in the 77th annual Macy's Thanksgiving Day Parade in New York City.

In addition to his involvement with Miami University, Mr. Shaffer has over 550 compositions and arrangements in print. His compositions have been used at clinics and music festivals around the world and have been placed on contest required-performance lists in the United States, Canada, Europe, Australia, and Asia. Mr. Shaffer has been the recipient of the ASCAP Standard Award in Music Composition for 37 years.

Under the direction of Mr. Shaffer, the Wyoming High School String Orchestra performed as the opening group at the 1984 Mid-West National Band and Orchestra Director's Clinic in Chicago. Additional Mid-West conducting appearances were in 2000 and 2001 when Mr. Shaffer guest conducted his compositions with the Robinson School Band, Fairfax, Va., and the South Central Middle School Band, Carterville, Ga.

Currently residing in Boston, Massachusetts, Mr. Shaffer is in demand as a conductor for honor bands, new music reading clinics, music festivals, and music education seminars. During the summer of 1986 and 1992, he served as instrumental director for the Saskatchewan School of Fine Arts. In February of 1997 he conducted a program of his music, with the China Youth Corps Band in the National Concert Hall, Taipei, Taiwan. In April of 2011 Mr. Shaffer premiered his composition *At The Red Creek* with the Musikkapelle Rothenbach, at Rothenbach, Germany.
